What does it mean to volunteer?

Volunteering means doing something "good" or "helpful" for someone, something (such as the environment) or some organization, without expecting something in return.



Sure, kids can help their parents by doing chores around the house. Or parents can help their kids by looking over their homework. These things are great, but not quite the same as volunteering. When you think about volunteering, you should think about the needs of your community. This directory is designed to give helpful information to those that want to meet those needs and to show others that volunteering is very important.



Now volunteering can have a different meaning for different people, but every volunteer can admit that it makes you feel good! The feeling of success can be achieved through volunteering to better the community around you.

Choosing a Volunteer Direction

Before you begin to volunteer, it's very important to decide what type of volunteer activity really interests or excites you.



Do you want to start with a volunteer activity that is familiar to you, or an activity that presents a challenge, or one that lets you blend your skills and interest with new opportunities.

Another idea is to "invent" your own volunteer project. The possibilities are endless!

Or you may find a need that could be met by forming a volunteer group headed by you and/or a family in your own church or school.
